Trafficking is a form of exploitation (usually sexual) through force, fraud, or coercion. In 2024, over 21,000 victims of trafficking\* were identified in the U.S.

And, that’s just the cases that were reported.



***She’s My Sister*** is a faith-forward organization empowering communities to stand together in the fight to end sex trafficking. We believe everyone has the right to freedom.

***The Sisterhood Table: Unbound*** is a national movement, calling women from every background to gather for meaningful conversations that can change—and even save—lives.

Each Sisterhood Table raises awareness, increases prevention, and helps raise funds for safe houses and resources for women who escaped being sexually exploited and trafficked.

## **EXIT: ESCAPING EXPLOITATION**

When a woman makes the courageous decision to leave a trafficking situation, she often needs transportation to help her escape - and a safe place to go right away as we begin to connect her to resources.

## **RESOURCES: BASIC HUMAN DIGNITY**

Often when a woman exits a life of exploitation, she leaves with nothing but the clothes she is wearing. Hygiene kits, clothes, & counseling help her feel more like a person and restore basic human dignity.

---

## **RESTORATION: THE JOURNEY TO SELF-WORTH**

A woman's self-worth is shattered when she is sold for sex. She must learn to rebuild her life from the ground up. And, she needs a safe place to do that. A tiny home of her own provides the stability she needs to move forward on her journey to restoration.

**Here are the three steps to get started:**

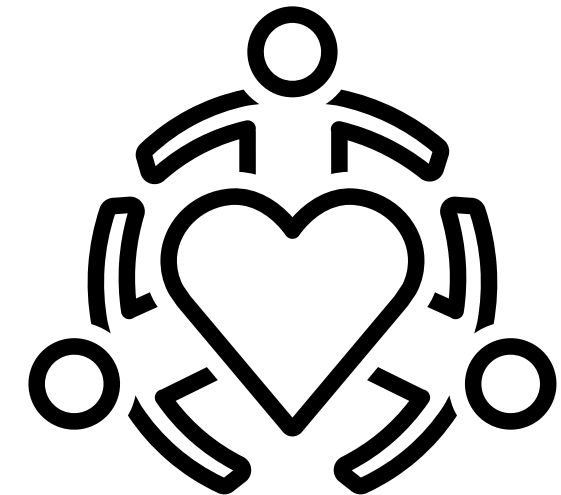

1: Use the template provided to email or text your family, friends, book club, co-workers, or small group and invite them to attend a small Sisterhood Table gathering at your home.



2: Play the introduction video (available on Youtube, our website, and also on the link we provided) and then use the talking points provided to guide conversation.



3: Offer next steps if any of your attendees want to get involved such as:

- ~ Take the pledge to talk to 5 people about trafficking
- ~ Host their own Sisterhood Table
- ~ Donate via the website link provided

# SUGGESTED OUTLINE FOR YOUR EVENT: APPROXIMATELY 60 - 90 MINUTES



- 10 - 15 MINUTES • **Welcome your guests:** Breaking bread brings people together so refreshments are suggested, but entirely optional. A fancy tea or potluck snacks, whatever you and your guests are comfortable with is fine!
- 3 - 5 MINUTES • **Offer a brief overview:** Use the provided talking point card to offer a brief outline of why this issue matters. Provide 1-2 key facts or statistics using non-graphic language.
- 10 - 15 MINUTES • **Play the introduction video:** The video is available on Youtube, our website, and also on the link we provided. A laptop, iPad, TV or even a phone will work to share the ~10 minute video.
- 15 - 30 MINUTES • **Guide discussion:** Use the provided talking points to engage your guests in a safe and comfortable conversation. Offer next steps and pass out the **Next Steps** card for your guests. Offer the **Resource Card** as needed for anyone feeling triggered.
- 5 MINUTES • **Wrap up:** Close the event by sharing how this table helps: by turning awareness into action; gifts fund urgent needs; and the next “yes” multiplies impact.
- 5 MINUTES • **Take a group photo:** If everyone consents, take a quick photo of your group and upload it to our private Facebook group!
- 2 MINUTES • **Complete Host Report:** Let us know how it went! Offer suggestions and feedback so we can continue to make The Sisterhood Table: Unbound even better!

## SAFETY & SELF-CARE

Human trafficking and sexual exploitation can be a sensitive topic and could even trigger someone if they have been a victim of a sex crime, exploitation, or even abuse. Make sure to take care of yourself and your guests with these tips in mind:

- DO: Use non-graphic, dignity-first language; avoid details.
- DO: If someone discloses: **thank them**, avoid probing, share the **Resource Card**, offer to step aside to connect.
- DO: Focus on the hope that awareness and education provides. Keep the attention on the positive: simply by attending, your guests are getting involved and helping eradicate trafficking.
- DON'T: Take any photos of your guests without permission. We love to see photos of the events as long as consent is given.
- DON'T: Share any survivor stories or photos without explicit written consent.
